Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2021-22 educational progress for Lyons School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2021-22 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2021-22. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school was identified as a Comprehensive Schools Support and Improvement (CSI).

The data in the AER indicates Lyons Elementary School is facing challenges unique to the Lansing School District. These challenges to academic achievement include high rates of student mobility and attendance issues. The Lyons' School Improvement Plan focuses on increasing student achievement in all areas with a focus on math and literacy. For example, Lyons has three Highly Qualified paraprofessionals devoted to supporting and strengthening the skills of low achieving students. In addition, teachers are involved in continuous professional development in math, literacy and student engagement. A Student Support Specialist also supports students who are facing attendance and socioemotional challenges.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

Students that attend Lyons Elementary School include students in our attendance area as designated by the Lansing School District. Families may also choose Lyons

Elementary School as their child's home school by following the "Schools of Choice" process managed through the Lansing School District.

In regard to our School Improvement Plan, we continuously work toward the development of academic skills across all core subject areas ultimately having 100% proficiency as our goal. In addition, we believe that part of our responsibility as educators is to support the development of a child's physical, social, mental and spiritual health to create a dynamic school culture of caring, invested and independent thinking students.

Through the School Improvement Process, we have implemented a more consistent, culturally responsive positive behavior intervention support system within our school, as well as established school wide behavior expectations and discipline referral protocol. Lyons Elementary School continues to focus on four school improvement goals. These goals include increasing student proficiency in reading, writing and math. We have also developed an intervention plan to strategically target early learning skills in English Language Arts. We continue to teach and reinforce basic math concepts required through the Common Core State Standards. Our School Improvement team is comprised of a variety of stakeholders, including the school administrator, teachers, parents and community members. Lyons Elementary School is devoted to making significant progress in each of its goals.

Lyons Elementary School is a small neighborhood school comprised of preschool through grade three. Lyons is located in south Lansing. Lyons currently has students of varying ethnic and socioeconomic backgrounds. Lyons employs 10 classroom teachers, a halftime resource room teacher, a paraprofessional and a student support specialist. Lyons strives to develop and maintain strong parent and community partnerships. Our Parent Teacher Association continually offers a wealth of support and activities for our school community. The core curriculum and content standards are implemented with fidelity by the teaching staff at Lyons Elementary School through the use of best practices for teaching and learning.

Lyons assess Kindergarten and First Grade three times a year using AimsWeb. Second and Third Grade are assessed three times a year using NWEA. Here are our Aggregate Test Scores:

- a. Winter AIMSweb 21-22 Early Literacy Proficiency: 14.29%
- b. Winter AIMSweb 22-23 Early Literacy Proficiency: 12.24%
- c. Winter AIMSweb 21-22 Early Numeracy Proficiency: 24.10%
- d. Winter AIMSweb 22-23 Early Numeracy Proficiency: 19.59%
- e. Winter NWEA Reading 21-22: 12.94%
- f. Winter NWEA Reading 22-23: 8.33%

- g. Winter NWEA Math 21-22: 9.76%
- h. Winter NWEA Math 22-23: 8.33%

Lyons Elementary School continues to strive for 100% parent participation at its fall and spring parent-teacher conferences. The 2017-2018, 2019-2020, and 2020-2021 fall-spring conference rates were 88% and for 2021-2022 was 82%.

Lyons Elementary School will continue to strive for excellence in every facet of its educational program. Through the efforts of its teaching staff, parents and community members, Lyons will strive to live out its mission of "Excellence for all Students".
