School Annual Education Report (AER) Cover Letter

August 16, 2014

Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2013-2014 educational progress for the Mt. Hope Elementary School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability and teacher quality. If you have any questions about the AER, please contact Elizabeth Jones for assistance.

The state has identified some schools with the status of Reward, Focus or Priority. A Reward school is one that is outperforming other schools in achievement, growth, or is performing better than other schools with a similar student population. A Focus school is one that has a large achievement gap in 30% of its student achievement scores. A Priority school is one whose achievement and growth is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. Our school has not been identified as a Reward, Focus, or Priority school.

Our test results show fourth grade students are improving in all areas. Students were close to the state averages in reading with significant growth for African American students who achieved 75.8% proficiency on the 4th grade test. Students in grades 5 and 6 showed an overall decline in their test scores and fell well-below the state's average in all content areas. We continue to have a disproportionate number of African-American students scoring not proficient on the MEAP, compared to other ethnic groups. White students' proficiency rate in 5th and 6th grade math is more than three times greater than African-American student rates.

Our school is transitioning to a magnet school with a focus on STEAM (science, technology, engineering, arts, and mathematics). We plan to continue to analyze and monitor our student achievement data in efforts to close the achievement gap in various demographic groups. We will have a student assistance provider who will help determine underlying causes for student behavioral issues that may impede student achievement.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

1. During the 2013-14 school year, students were assigned to Mt. Hope Elementary School based upon the school boundaries for attendance area and schools of choice. For the current school year, all students must apply and submit an enrollment form to attend the Mt. Hope STEAM Magnet School. We have become a school of choice for all students who wish to attend.
2. Mt. Hope Elementary School monitors the implementation of the School Improvement Plan throughout the school year. Staff meeting time is allocated for the discussion of items in the plan and to make adjustments to activities, as needed.
3. At Mt. Hope STEAM Magnet School, we will use the teaching method of Project Based Learning, or PBL, to help students learn better. Projects give students the chance to apply the skills they learn in school to personally relevant and real-world situations. The students in our school will learn how to think like young engineers and design products that may be solutions to real-world problems. They will apply their knowledge of science and mathematics, learn skills to think critically, work in teams, make presentations, and use technology.
4. Parent-friendly guides to the core curriculum will be made available at our school. Our staff will provide outlines of the curriculum to parents and discuss expectations for grade level competencies during conferences.
5. MEAP student achievement in reading for grades 5 and 6 declined by 3.8%, but increased by 4.4% for grade 4. The average decrease in math for grades 5 and 6 was 2.3%, but grade 4 increased by 5.5%. Writing in grade 4 increased by 14.8%, grade 5 science decreased by 2.7% and grade 6 social studies scores decreased by 9.8%.
