

Sheridan Road STEM Magnet School School Annual Education Report (AER) Cover Letter

Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2021-22 educational progress for Sheridan Road. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2021-22 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2021-22. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school was identified as an Additional Targeted Schools Support (ATS).

We are identified as an ATS school due to three of our student subgroups performing in the bottom 25% across the state. The sub groups that fell into this category are our students with disabilities, our Hispanic students, and our socioeconomic disadvantaged students.

Due to this, measures have been put in place to better address student needs. Student achievement scores have been collected using the NWEA assessment. This data shows that during 21-22 Winter NWEA Reading assessment Sheridan Road students averaged 8.03% proficiency. In Winter of 22-23 the staff has helped the students raise that to 12.11% proficient in Reading. Winter NWEA Math assessment scores for 21-22 shows a student average of 3.30% proficiency. In Winter of 22-23, the staff has helped the students raise that to 3.72% proficient in Math.

State law requires that we also report additional information.





Sheridan Road's enrollment is through the district office schools of choice options (offered once a year). Students could also enroll online at http://www.lansingschools.net/academic-choices/enrollment/.

Sheridan Road's School Improvement Plan and goals are reviewed annually, and revised as needed for depth, clarity, and best practice. Our goals are data driven, using formative assessment data as a primary source of information guiding fundamental and incremental changes made each year. Sheridan Road is a STEM Magnet School. Students gain the 21st century skills necessary to become learners and leaders in our global economy. Engaging students in the areas of science, technology, engineering and mathematics builds a foundation for inquisitiveness, innovation and problem solving.

Sheridan Road has fully implemented the Common Core State Standards in area of Language Arts and Math and the NGSS/GLCE's in the areas of Science and Social Studies. During the spring of 2021, 59% of parents (180) attended parent teacher conferences. In the spring of 2022, 57% of parents (179 parents) attended parent teacher conferences.
