For the 2023-2024 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2022-23. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2022-23. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2022-23. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.





At Lansing Technical High School, key challenges identified in the Annual Education Report include persistent achievement gaps, particularly in reading and mathematics. To address these challenges, the school is implementing several targeted initiatives, including differentiated instruction, personalized tutoring sessions, and increased access to technology for all students. Additionally, professional development is being provided to educators to enhance their ability to support diverse learning needs. The school is also strengthening community and family engagement to ensure students have the support they need both in and outside the classroom. These efforts are designed to accelerate student achievement and close the achievement gaps, providing all students with the opportunity to succeed.

Students enrolled at Lansing Technical High School generally live within the assigned attendance area for the building. Students may also enroll via Schools of Choice and administrative transfer.

A School Improvement plan is in place to continue working primarily on improving literacy throughout the school and creating a positive culture and climate for students and staff. As well as focusing on students becoming career and college ready.

Lansing Technical High School offers a unique blend of academic rigor and hands-on learning, providing students with the opportunity to gain valuable skills for their future careers. The school offers a variety of specialized programs, including career and technical education in fields such as healthcare, automotive technology, and information technology, which equip students with industry-recognized certifications. What sets Lansing Technical apart is its commitment to personalized learning, ensuring students can pursue their passions while receiving the support they need to succeed.
