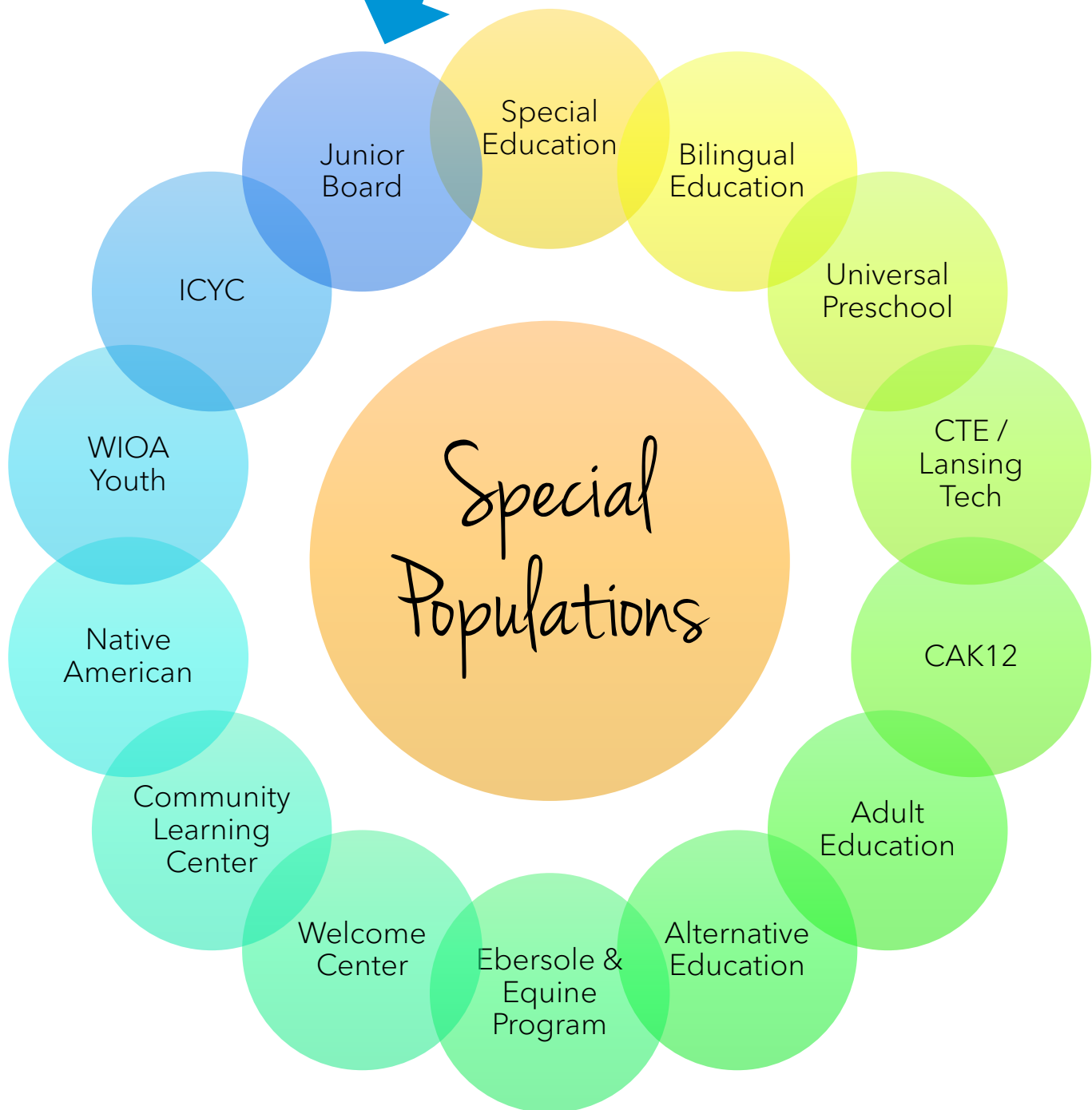

Special Education



Special Education

- The programs of the Special Education Department are broad based and offer a spectrum of supports. High Quality Special Education Programs and Services are located in every building and level throughout the Lansing School District.
 - The mandate for special education in Michigan is birth through age 26.
 - The District operates early childhood special education programs, K-12 support, and work-based programs for adults. Special education services are provided for children that covers thirteen different eligibility categories in Michigan along with related service needs.
- The district employs around 260 special education staff in 26 schools. There are over 1,800 students with IEPs.
- Programs and services are monitored for compliance with rules and regulations from Ingham ISD and the Michigan Department of Education.

individuals determine an evaluation
is necessary, the district provides
prior written notice to the parent
and seeks consent to evaluate.

NO

If the IEP team and other qualified
individuals determine there isn't
data to suspect a disability, or an
evaluation is not necessary, the
district provides prior written
notice to the parent of the decision
not to evaluate.

Evaluation is completed within 30
school days of receiving signed
parent consent and an IEP
meeting is scheduled

The Beekman Center has been in operation as a part of the Lansing School District since 1968. We currently service students with Moderate Cognitive Impairments, Severe Cognitive Impairments, Severe Multiple Impairments, and Adult Age Transition Ready Autism Spectrum Disorder. In addition, our Young Adult program provides life skills and transition activities for our Moderate Cognitive Impairment students ages 18-26.

Beekman teaches life skills!

The Beekman Center also houses our Community Based Instruction (CBI) program that gives our young adult students on the job training, as well as providing the students with classes in functional academics and other life skills subjects. The young adult students participate in a full spectrum of electives which may include Special Olympics. At the Beekman Center we acknowledge the holistic nature of the individual child, and we provide the assistance needed to help children with special needs achieve their full potential.

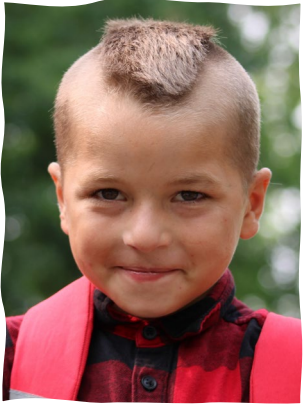

- The Lansing School District offers a FREE Preschool Program designed to prepare children for kindergarten. Classes are offered Monday, to Thursday throughout the school year, at various locations throughout the Lansing School District.
- To apply, the child must:
 - Be four years-old on or before December 1st, of the current school year.
 - Be a resident of the Lansing School District or have a Lansing address.
 - Children that are eligible for the Great Start Readiness Program and do not have a Lansing address but live in the Ingham intermediate School District Service area may be considered.
 - Priority for all preschool slots is given to Lansing School District residents.

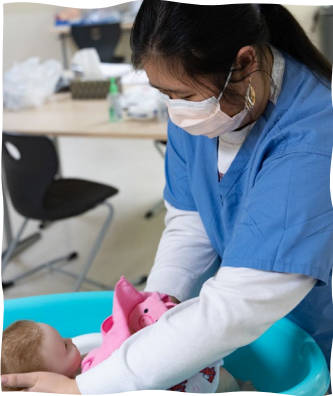
Career Technical Education

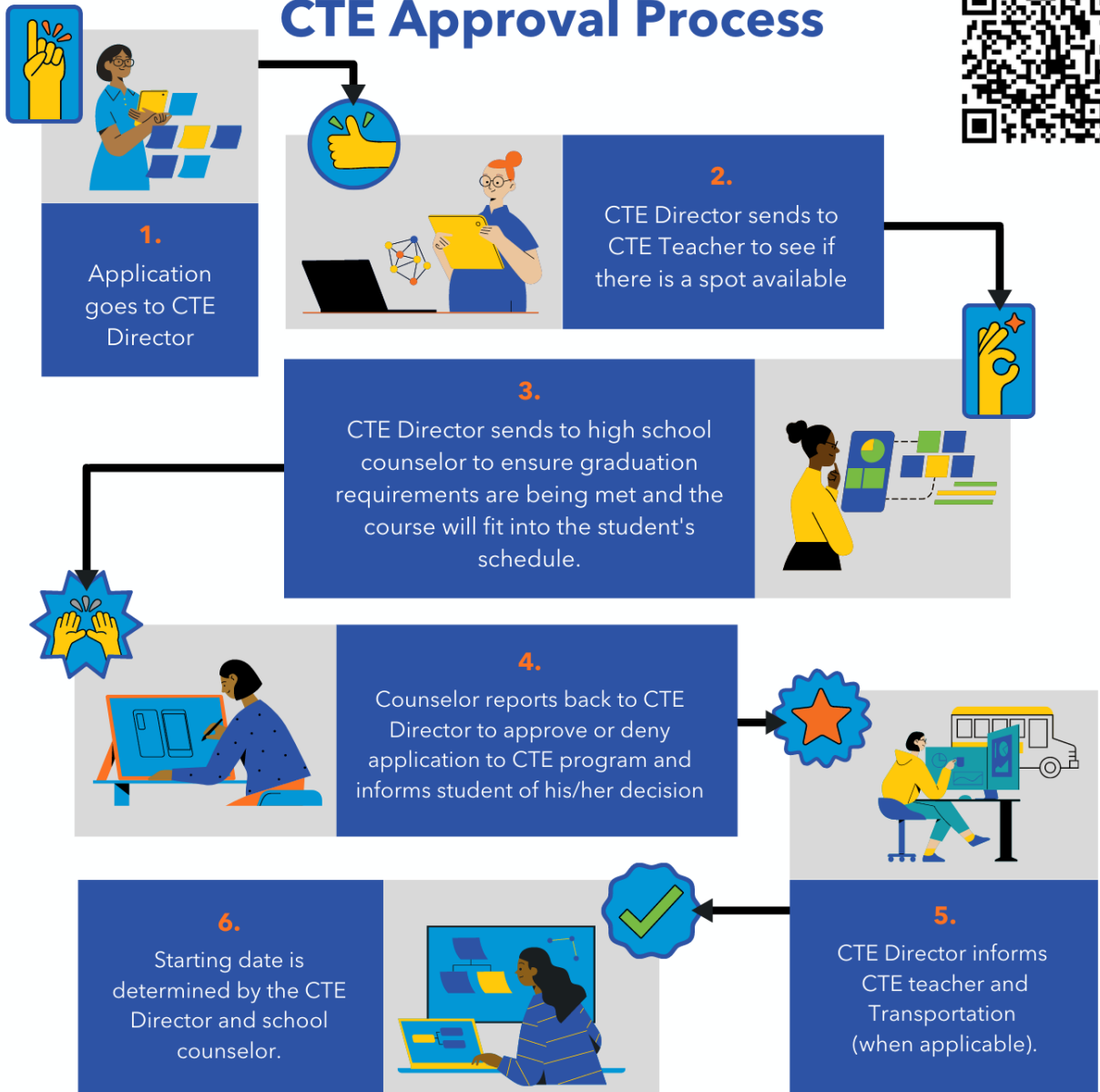

Lansing Technical High School

Lansing Technical High School, aka Lansing Tech, is a new career-focused high school that specializes in four high-demand pathways: Construction Science, Health Science, Computer Science & Coding, and Culinary Arts. Opening its doors in August 2023, the first cohort will serve one-hundred ninth graders and within four years the school will serve 400 students in grades 9-12.

In addition to the learning that students will receive in their core classes, Lansing Tech students will also be provided access to real-world experiences and career training. In partnership with industry professionals and post-secondary institutions, our learners will have the opportunity to graduate with industry certifications, workforce training, and college credits.
