



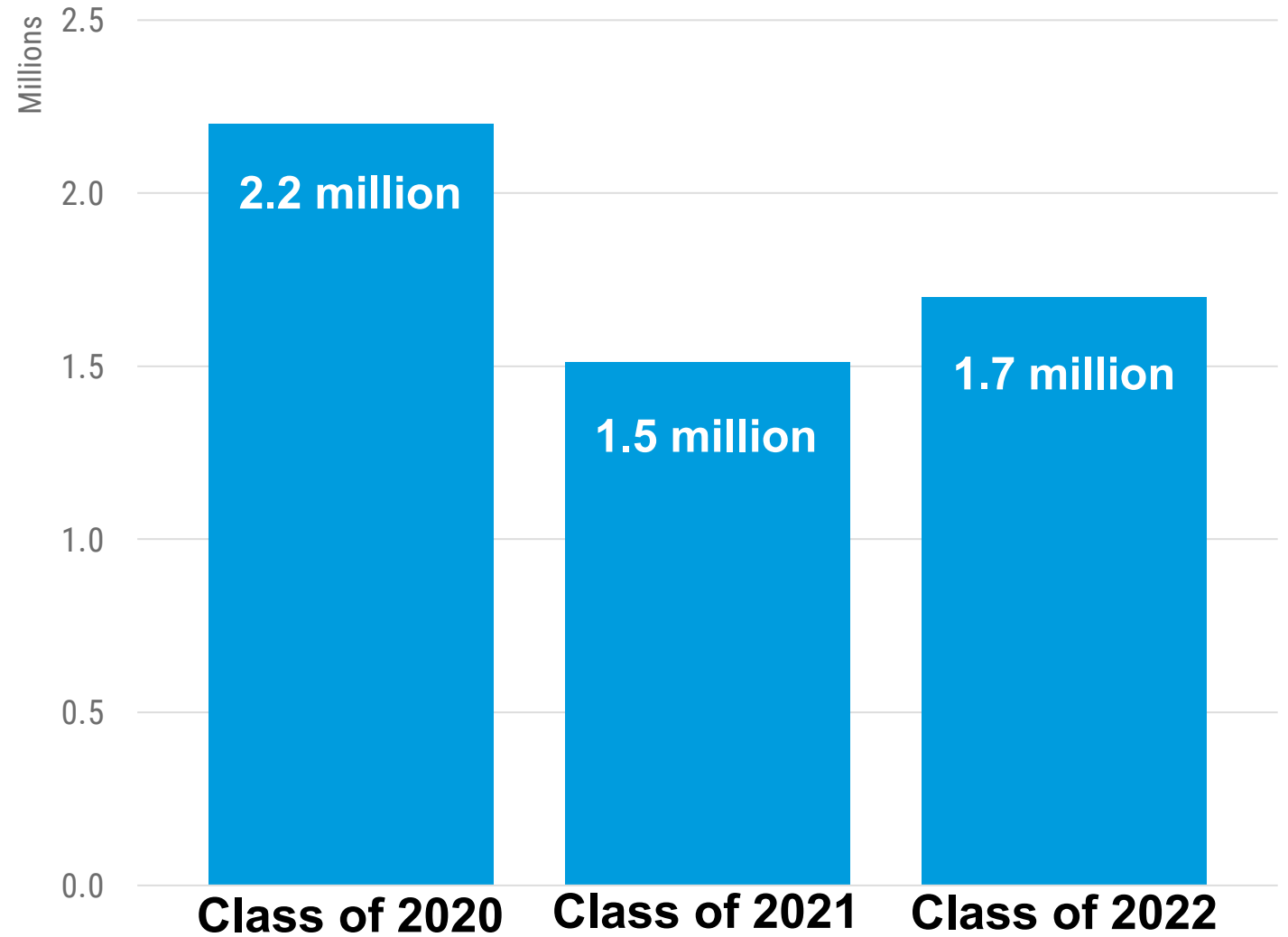

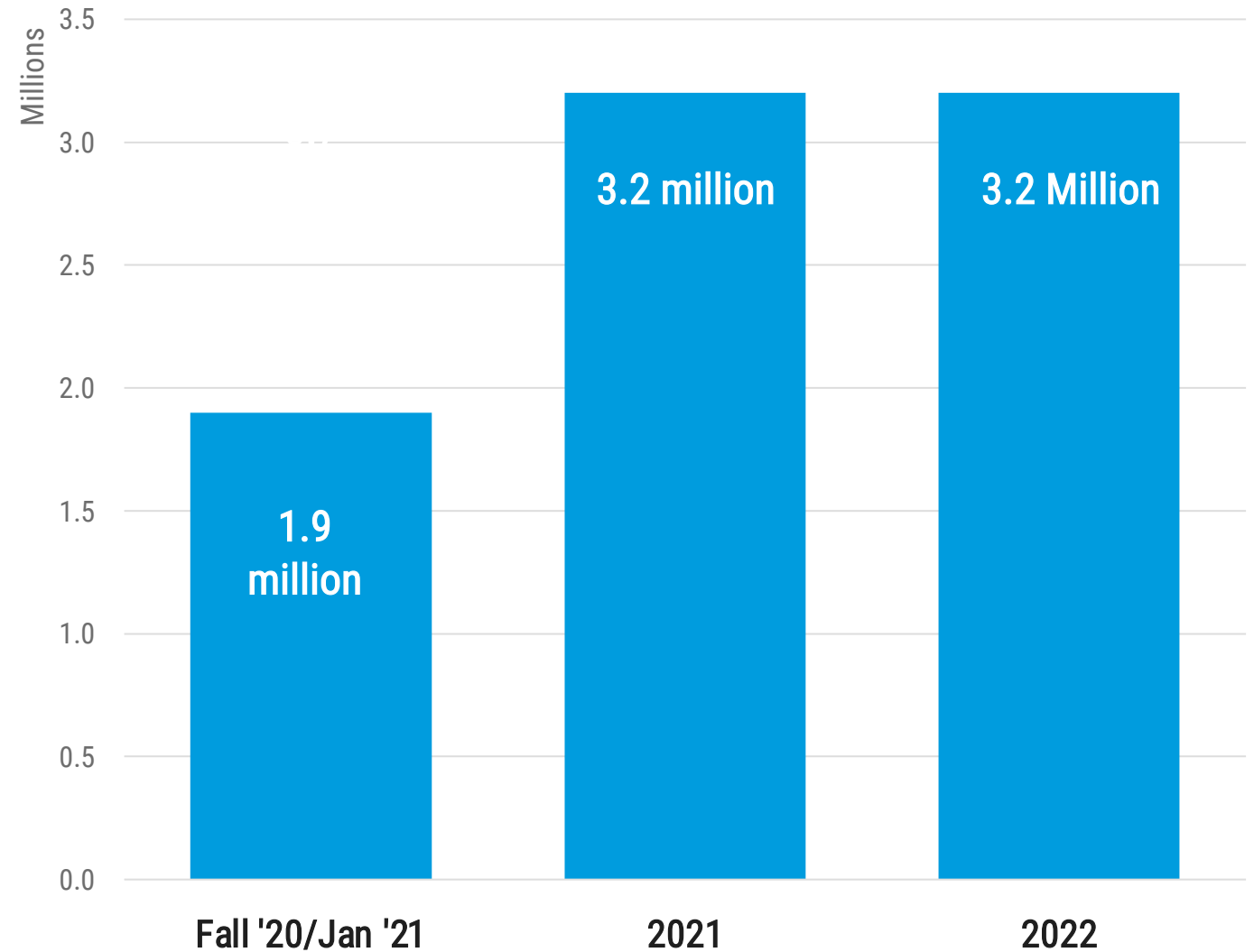

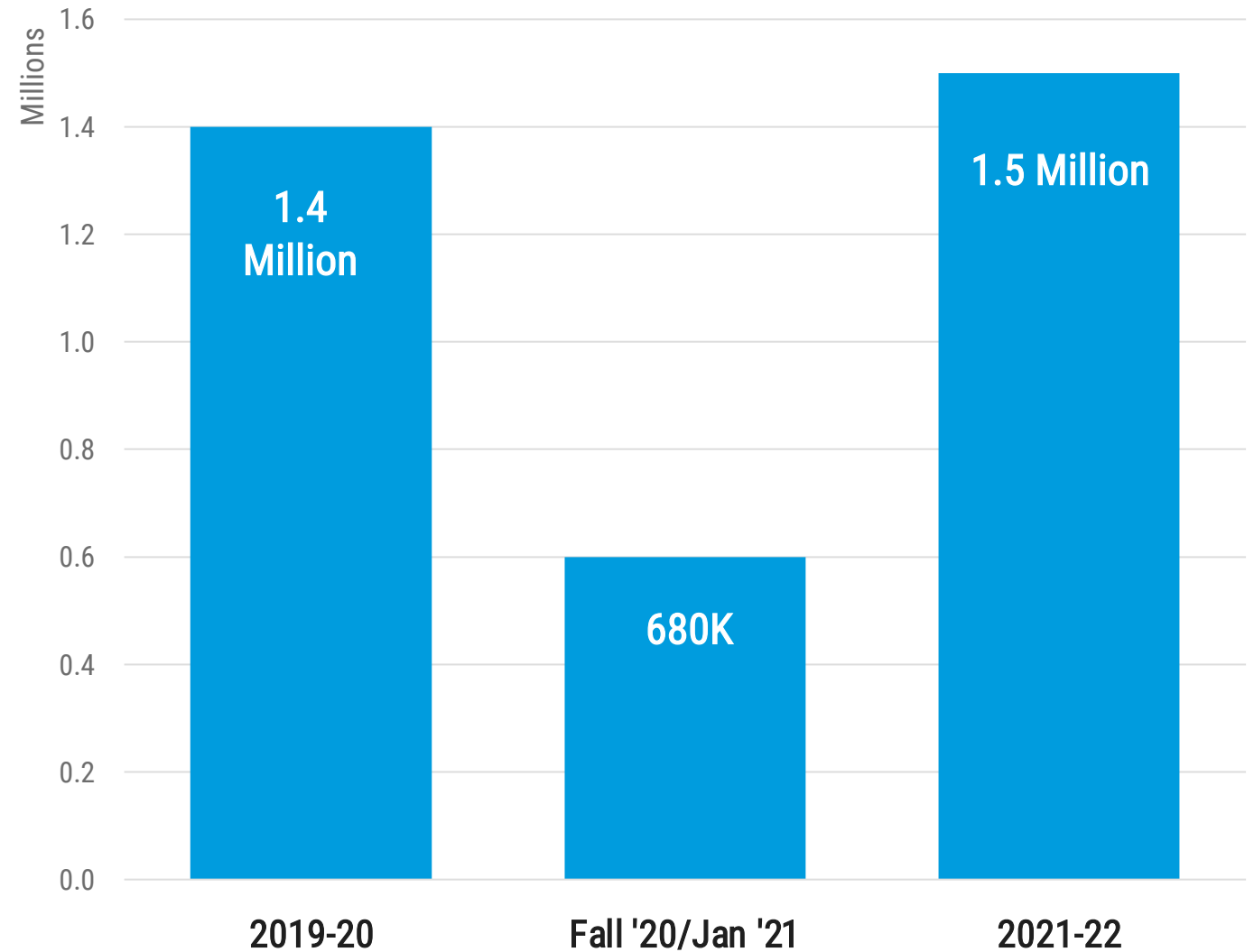
# SAT participation by graduating cohort



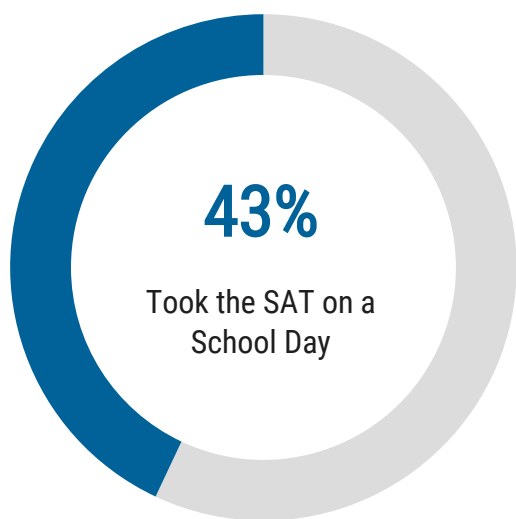

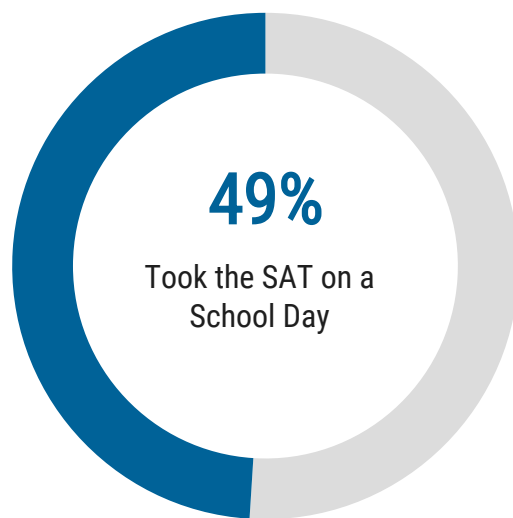
# PSAT 8/9 Administration



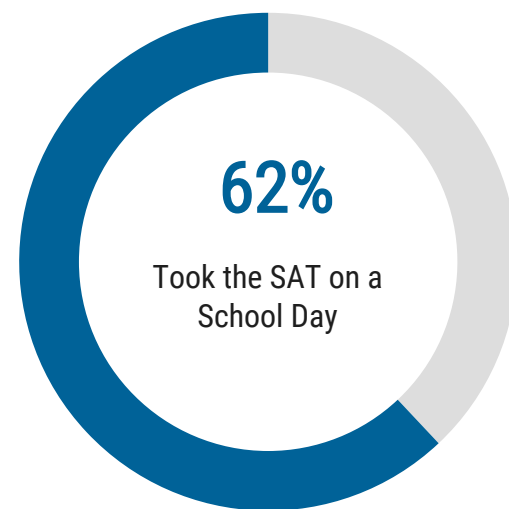
# Proportion of SAT takers who take the SAT on a school day



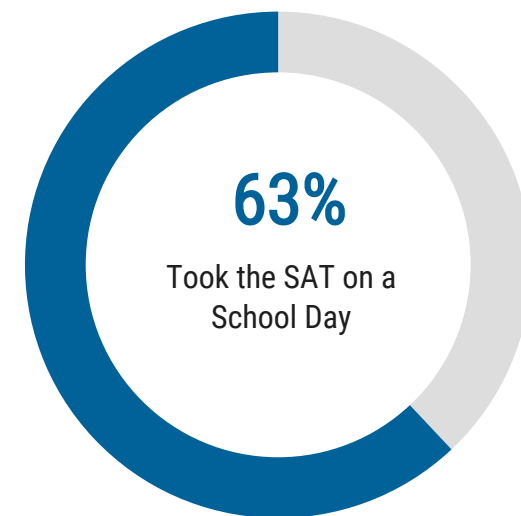

# Multi-Stage Adaptive Testing vs Item Level Adaptive Testing

	Multi-Stage Adaptive Testing (MST)	Item Adaptive
Test Delivery	Sets of questions (called modules)	One item at a time
Adaptive	Based on how students perform in the previous module	Based on a student responds to each question
Navigation	Students can review items within a module	Students are not able to go back to a question
Test Length	Supports shorter test lengths	Supports shorter test lengths
Examples	GRE, digital SAT	ACCUPLACER, SBAC, NWEA – MAP, NCLEX

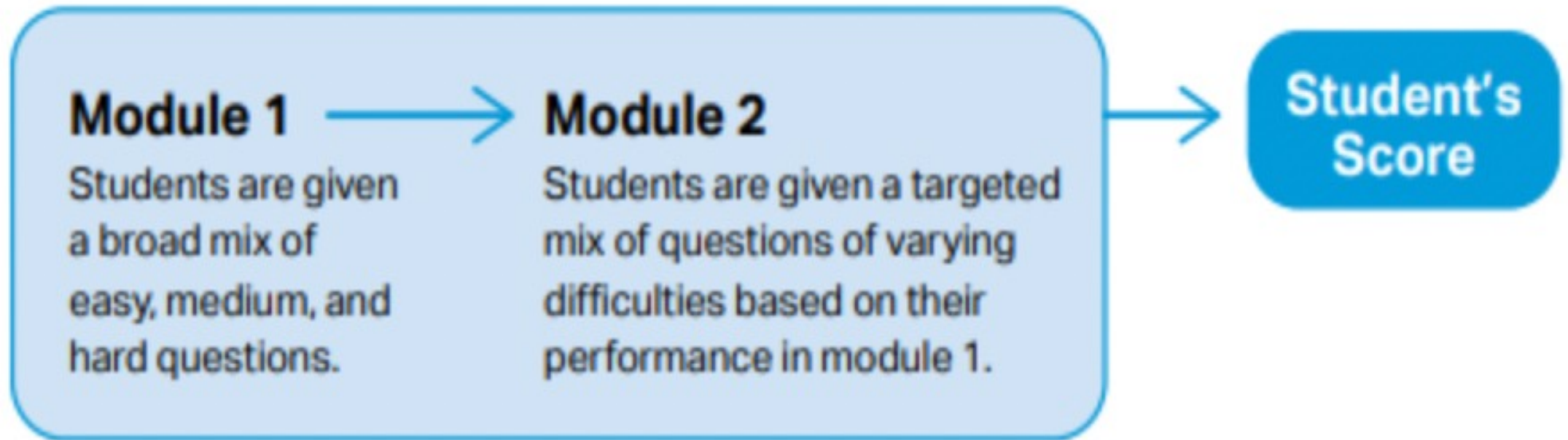

# Benefits of Multi-Stage Adaptive Testing

- ✓ Shorter tests
- ✓ Questions are tailored according to students' achievement
- ✓ Allows students to navigate back to questions within a module
- ✓ More secure testing
- ✓ Allows disruptions in internet connectivity
- ✓ More precise measurement

# Device Specifications

- Windows laptops/tablets must be running Windows 10 or later and have at least 250 MB of free space available.
- Mac laptops must be running macOS 11.4 or later and have at least 150 MB of free space available.
- iPads must be running iPadOS 13.4 or later and have at least 150 MB of free space available.
- School-managed Chromebooks must be running Chrome OS 83 or later and have at least 150 MB of free space available. (Note: if your device is running Chrome OS 99, the operating system will need to be updated.) You cannot run Bluebook on a personal Chromebook.

# Network Requirements

All students and testing staff (coordinators, proctors, and monitors) must connect to your Wi-Fi on test day. This includes:

Students and testing staff who are unaffiliated with your institution.

Students and testing staff who are using personal devices.

You may need to set up guest access. Be sure to share the network password with staff so they can share it with students.

# For millions of students, test scores can strengthen their college applications.

- In the class of 2022, nearly 1.3 million U.S. students had SAT scores that confirmed or exceeded their high school GPA.
- Among those students, more than 400,000 were African American or Latino, nearly 350,000 were first-generation college goers, and nearly 250,000 were from small towns or rural communities.

### *NEW in 23-24!*

For all districts and schools there will be *expanded low-income support* price adjustments for all grades/assessments and discounts for *multi-assessment adoption (when applicable)*.

# Low-Income Adjustment Pricing

College Board is expanding its support for schools serving low-income students by providing price adjustments based on each district’s estimated poverty rate. These adjustments will automatically be applied at the district and/or school level.

SAT School Day	Poverty Rate Percent x 2
PSAT/NMSQT - 11 <sup>th</sup> grade	Poverty Rate Percent x 2
PSAT/NMSQT – All other grades	Poverty Rate Percent
