Principled - The Learner Profile Attribute of the Month

"Character is doing the right thing when nobody's look-ing."

J.C. Watts

As a way to show we are "Up for the Challenge, Post Oak Academy will continue its practice of focusing on a Learner Profile attribute each month during the 2020/2021 school year. The goal is to encourage our students to demonstrate these characteristics in order to become a more internationally minded learner.

During the month of September, Post Oak will focus on the Learner Profile attribute, PRINCIPLED. Being principled, according to the IB Learner Profile, means being someone who will "act with integrity and honesty, with a strong sense of fairness and justice, and with respect for the dianity and rights of people everywhere...[and will] take responsibility for...[his or her] actions and their consequences." A key part of this definition is the inclusion of the word "integrity." Meaning they will do the right thing even when no one is watching. At Post Oak we use the words "I do what is right, even when no one is looking".

Here are some suggested ways to encourage your child to be responsible and make good choices.

- Have your child share with you his/her Google classroom expectations and then daily share a good choice they made during synchronous and asynchronous time.
- Work with your child on being responsible by helping them to complete their homework.
- Think about various activities your child participates in and have them create a "t-chart" sharing what it "looks like" and "sounds like" when someone is being principled while participating in these activities.
- Review what it means to display academic honesty with your child.

- Create a chore chart with your child and discuss with them his/her responsibility


